Level C Lots 7 and 9 stay the same, lot 8 is any holiday themed
cake; think outside the box.

Level D Lots 10 and 11 stay the same; Lot 12 decorated 2 layer
cake (minimum) using advanced techniques.

Example: drip cake

Level B lot 23 adds hot or cold

lot 24 changes to skillet meal, breakfast, lunch or dinner

lot 25 stays the same

Level C lot 26 stays the same

lot 27 changes to a fruit based dessert

lot 28 stays the same

Level D all stays the same

Fair Exhibits All remains the same except lot 120 which becomes monkey
