- About learning, exploring and having fun
- Open to ALL youth in Kindergarten (5K) through High School
 - o Our youngest members (5K-2nd grade) can enroll in the Cloverbud project
 - o Youth in 3rd grade and above can chose from 60+ hands-on project areas, including arts, animals, leadership, sciences and more
- Family focused youth attend local club meetings with their parents and siblings, where they participate in decision-making, teamwork, and community service
 - Parents are encouraged to get involved as 4-H volunteer leaders
- Open to new enrollments all year, but most youth join between Oct. 1 – Dec. 1
- All 4-H members must be enrolled in a 4-H club by December 1st to be eligible to show their projects at the Green County Fair in July

How to Join

1. Learn about clubs in your area.

You are encouraged to call the contact person for a couple different clubs and find out more about the club and its members.

- 2. Select a club that fits your family's interests and schedule.
- 3. Start attending club meetings, where you will receive a 4-H Enrollment Guide and support from 4-H leaders in getting enrolled in 4-H and choosing projects for your child.
