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2021-2022 SMART Goals (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, & Time bound)

In Green County 4-H this year, we want to focus our smart goals on BELONGING and SPARK. But why?

- Belonging situation – We have approximately 35-40 new families in Green County 4-H this year. We also continue to hear concern about losing high school youth to FFA. We say we want older youth involved as youth leaders, but do we always involve them in meaningful ways?
- Sparks situation – We are slowly coming out of a pandemic, where some club meetings were few and far between, and almost no project committees met. Only 4 leaders showed up to the County 4-H Project Committee Kick-Off meeting. Yet we know, families come to 4-H expecting hands-on learning opportunities in a variety of projects.

The 4-H Adult Leaders Association has two key assets: (1) People Power – over 150 adult volunteers, and (2) Financial Resources. What specifically is it that the 4-H Adult Leaders Association can realistically do with their key assets to help address these needs? Specifically...

- Program Quality: #5 – What can the 4-H Adult Leaders Association do to provide youth more opportunities to explore and learn about something they really care about?
- Expanding Access: #7 – What can the 4-H Adult Leaders Association do to improve how youth and families feel welcomed, wanted and supported in our 4-H program?

2020-2021 Progress on Goals – How were youth involved in completing the SMART goals from the previous 4-H program year?

- Goal #1 - 50% of 4-H Adult Leaders meetings will include all three components of an effective meeting. (Education, Recreation and Business)
 - *We incorporated recreation and education into most meetings, which occasionally included a youth presenting or helping to lead.*
- Goal #2 - By August 2021, our 4-H Adult Leaders Association members will help new families (in 1st-4th year) feel welcome and create a feeling of belonging by strengthening lines of communication and making three phone calls to new families around key times during the year.
 - *Executive Board members signed up to call new families.*
