New Family Corner

Each newsletter, this section will provide some helpful insights into the 4-H program for our new and newer families.

4-H Club Meetings

Almost every 4-H club holds regular club meetings. Even within the same club, no two club meetings are the same. Ideally, every meeting should have three parts—recreation (fun), business, and learning. Youth leadership plays a huge role in the success of a club.

Most clubs have youth officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and other selected roles) who are responsible for running each meeting. Youth leaders not only gain excellent life skills, they help to keep the meeting relevant and fun for members of all ages. All youth have a responsibility to contribute to their clubs through their voice and their actions!

What is my role as an adult?

Adults help create a safe and positive atmosphere for all 4-H members when they empower and encourage youth. While at a meeting, it's important to be a positive role model for everyone in attendance. Caring adults play an important role in the mental health of youth, and 4-H can help connect youth with positive adults.

Make a 4-H Meeting a Positive Experience

- 1. Actively listen to all 4-H members.
- 2. Let youth run the meeting. It's their club!
- 3. Attend as many meetings as possible.
- 4. Ask your club leader how you can help.
- 5. If you have a hobby or skill, consider offering to be a guest speaker!

4-H Educational Travel Experiences

Wisconsin 4-H is happy to once again offer some outstanding educational travel experiences. These are so much more than "trips", rather they are powerful opportunities for personal exploration and leadership development. WI 4-H Summer Academy (June 19-22, 2023 @ UW-Madison) This new Positive Youth Development program will help you discover pathways to your future. Sign up to learn what it takes to have a career, or a hobby in several SPARK areas including agriculture, STEM, service, leadership, arts, trades, and many more. Youth must be in 7th-10th grade at the time of registration. The cost will be approximately \$400 (includes lodging and meals). Stay tuned for more details.

National 4-H Congress (November 24-28, 2023 to Atlanta, Georgia) This is a five-day Educational Experience held in Atlanta, GA. Congress is the premiere nation-wide event for 4-Hers to network with others from around the country, Canada, and Puerto Rico. While at Congress, 4-Hers engage in leadership, citizenship, global awareness, and inclusion. Youth must be in 9th-12th grade at the time of registration, and maximum age of 18 as of 1/1/2023. The cost will be approximately \$1,200. More information to come!





Green County 4-H Scholarship & Award Opportunities

The Green County 4-H program uses an application and interview process to support youth building life skills, while pursuing extraordinary 4-H opportunities and recognitions...

- **4-H Travel Scholarships** Funds to cover 25% of a 4-H Travel Experience (6th-12th Gr)
- 4-H Key Award Top award a WI 4-H Youth can receive (11th-13th Gr)
- 4-H College Scholarships Funds (\$500-\$1,000) for posthigh school education (12th-13th Gr)

There are three parts to this process...

- Application—Youth submit a cover letter, resume and essay by Tuesday, February 7, 2023.
- **Interview**—Youth applicants will participate in an interview **on Wednesday, February 15, 2023**.
- **Feedback**—Youth receive written feedback to help improve future applications and interviews.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships, students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2023-2024 academic school year. Becoming a 4-H Adult Volunteer

Volunteers are critical to the success of the 4-H program! Are you interested in working with youth to plan project learning opportunities, create community service activities, or chaperone an overnight 4-H experience?

To ensure volunteers are prepared for their positions, Extension requires several things of all applicants:

- Register (https://v2.4honline.com/) and agree to behavior expectation
- 2. Pass a criminal background check every 4 years
- Complete several trainings, most of which can be done online. Topics include youth protection, creating safe spaces, risk management and youth development.





Livestock Skill-a-thon: Test your knowledge of the species and the industry through a written quiz and learning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification and demonstrating evaluation skills.

4-H Dairy Bowl

Saturday, February 25, 2023 UW Green Bay STEM Innovations Center



This program is open to anyone, in grades 3-13, in the dairy project. Dairy Bowl is designed to help youth understand more about dairy cattle and the Dairy industry. This allows you to branch out, meet new people, and create teamwork skills that will last a lifetime.

Participants will be asked two sets of oral questions each about different topics. Topics include nutrition, breed specific, dairy cattle biology, and many more!

Green County can put together a team of 3-4 youth, or youth can individually compete as part of an All-Wisconsin Team. The All-Wisconsin team is a team that is made up of kids from around the state that want to participate but don't have a full

team or are a single from their county. Teams will be assigned by the state office.

Swine

2023 Swine ID Procedure

Green County Fair Swine Exhibitors will be required to self-identify their pigs with RFID tags, picked up at the Green County Extension office and do picture identifications for each fair pig. There will be no upfront cost to the exhibitor, as the Green County Meat Animal Auction Committee covers the cost of the tags. Swine exhibitors will be required to pick up their Identification kits and tags, tag their pigs and return their picture forms to the Extension office between March 20 - April 14 to exhibit their pigs at the 2023 Green County Fair.

The Green County Extension office will again loan out ear taggers for exhibitors to use for tagging their pigs. The taggers must be returned to the Extension office and will be sanitized before being given to another farm to prevent the spread of disease. Exhibitors will not be required to pay a fee for each Identification kit when they pick them up. 4-H Leaders and Agriculture instructors will be allowed to pick up ID kits for their members. However, they will be required to sign for all the kits that they pick up at the Extension office.

The kit will include YQCA information, Swine Picture Identification Forms and RFID ear tags. The Identification Forms must be returned to the Extension office by April 14. The forms should be delivered directly to the Extension office and not be mailed.

Wisconsin Pork Association Youth Pig Project

The Wisconsin Pork Association is offering Youth Pig Project scholarships designed to assist 4-H and FFA members in establishing swine projects that can lead to development of life skills and career opportunities in the WI pork industry. 4-H and FFA youth are eligible to apply for a \$100 scholarship used to offset costs associated with their 2023 pig project. Scholarships will be awarded in three age divisions: Ages 9-12, 13-15, and 16-19 (as of January 1, 2023). Interested youth may download the scholarship application form from the WPA website at www.wppa.org/youth-pig-project or call the WPA office at 608-723-7551 to have a copy mailed. Completed application forms must be emailed or postmarked no later than February 1, 2023.

2023 Market Lamb Identification

All market lambs being ID'd for the fair need to have an RFID tag and a scrapie tag. Picture ID Forms and RFID tags will be available April 17 through May 5 and must be returned to Extension Green County office before 4:30 PM on May 5 to exhibit market lambs at the 2023 Green County Fair. Lamb Picture ID Forms can list family youth, including all siblings, within the immediate family, with a maximum of 5 market lambs being entered for picture ID's. Lamb ID Forms can be mailed, emailed, or dropped off at the Extension Green County drop box in our front lobby.

2023 Share-a-Kid Contest

The Wisconsin Dairy Goat Association wants to promote interest in dairy goats by awarding 4-6 dairy goat kids to young people in a competitive statewide contest. Youth applicants will write an essay of 100 words or more about why they would like to have a dairy goat, how they are going to take care of her (food, shelter, and medical care), etc. The essay winners will be given a goat. - Green County Fair Exhibitors in Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Poultry & Rabbits
- Wisconsin State Fair Junior Exhibitors in Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Poultry & Rabbits

In 2023—Each individual Green County Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goat, Poultry or Rabbit Exhibitor MUST submit their YQCA Certificate of Completion number during the online fair entry process in order to be eligible to exhibit and/or sell your animal at the 2023 Green County Fair.

2023 YQCA Training Options

All 2023 YQCA Training options MUST be registered and paid for online at: https://yqcaprogram.org/

Three types of training are being offered in 2023:

Option A- Web-Based Training—Curriculum is tailored to an exhibitor's age for a better learning experience. Available 24/7, this training allows exhibitors flexibility to take the course at their convenience. Includes 3 interactive online modules and corresponding quizzes. Cost is \$12 per person, per year, and MUST be paid online.

Option B- Test-out option—Youth ages 12 (\$36), 15 (\$48), and 19 (\$36) may choose the test-out option. Youth must score 80% or better and you will only be charged if you pass the test. If you don't pass, you will be instructed to take the web-based training. If you pass, you will need to retest when you reach the next age split.

Option C—Instructor Led TrainingSessions will be held face-to-face and are limited to the first 50 youth. Youth MUST register, pay online, and complete the Pre-Test, BEFORE attending the training. Exhibitors need to arrive at least 10 minutes in advance of the session to check-in and MUST stay the full 60 minutes. Cost is \$3 per person, per year, and MUST be paid online at the time of registration. Exhibitors ages 19-21, as of December 31, 2022, CANNOT take the Instructor-Led Training, and instead must take the Web-Based Training.

- Click on "Register/Sign In". If you already have an account for YQCA, enter your username and password and "submit"
- If you do not have an account, click on "Register" to register a new account.

Select a Course—it is IMPORTANT to select the correct course for the youth's age, as of Dec. 31, 2022.

Purchase a Course—Select the state, and then select a Web-Based Training. You MUST pay online for the course. Keep a copy of your receipt/confirmation.

Pre-Test/Post-Test After selecting a course, you will be asked to do a "pre-test" which is merely a series of simple questions to answer. Once completed, you will be ready to proceed. After completing the training, you will be asked to do a Post-Test, again merely a series of simple questions to answer. After this is completed, you will be able to access your certificate and print it.

Submitting Certificate of Completion—Once the training is complete, return to the course menu screen to download a PDF of the Certificate of Completion with the youth's unique certificate number. Certificate numbers MUST be submitted during the Green County Fair online entry process in May 2023.

Presenting or speaking before a group or audience is an important life skill to develop. The goal of the Green County 4-H Communications Contest is to give 4-H youth an opportunity to develop and polish these skills in a supportive and encouraging environment. 4-H participants will be evaluated and provided constructive feedback on their presentation, each receiving a certificate of participation and a participation ribbon (gr. K-2) or ribbon placing (gr. 3-13).

This year's Communication Contest will have two divisions. Youth are eligible to submit one entry in each division.

SPEAKING DIVISION

DEMONSTRATION DIVISION

SPEAKING DIVISION:

Participants in the SPEAKING DIVISION will be categorized by Grade Level, each with a grade appropriate time limit.

Grade Levels: Cloverbud (Grades K-2): 1-3 minutes Beginner (Grades 3-5): 2-4 minutes

Intermediate (Grades 6-8): 3-5 minutes Senior (Grades 9 & Up): 4-7 minutes

SPEAKING DIVISION participants (K-13) will have the choice of presenting prose, poetry or a traditional speech.

- Prose/Poetry Options include: prose reading, poetry reading, a memorized piece, or storytelling, or an interpretive
 speech (a speech originally written and presented by someone else). You may edit your selection to meet the time
 requirement. Original poetry or stories can be used. Reciting the 4-H Pledge can be a great speech option for
 Cloverbuds. Presentations will be critiqued on use of introduction, voice, expression and appropriateness of
 material. If reading the selection, text should be mounted on construction paper instead of reading from a book. You
 should prepare and memorize an introduction that includes credit to the author(s) and any transitions that are
 needed if you have more than one piece. Props or costumes are not permitted.
- Traditional Speech Pick a topic of your choice and write an original, factual speech about it. This could be about a 4-H
 project you love or a current issue you are concerned about. Your speech could inform, persuade, or motivate your
 audience. You may use note cards during your presentation. You may also use visuals (posters, diagrams, power
 point) to help you deliver your speech, but NOT props or costumes. (Note, this is a speech, not a demonstration.)

DEMONSTRATION DIVISION:

Participants in the DEMONSTRATION DIVISION will be categorized by Grade Level, with a grade appropriate time limit.

Grade Levels: Cloverbud (Grades K-2): 2-4 minutes Beginner (Grades 3-5): 3-6 minutes Intermediate (Grades 6-8): 5-10 minutes Senior (Grades 9 & Up): 5-10 minutes

In this division, 4-H youth members demonstrate how to do something. A topic is chosen, often from a 4-H project. Props and visual aids are required; may include a homemade posters and/or computer presentation. A successful demonstration will show the audience and judges several steps in a process, such as preparing a cooked dish, grooming an animal, etc.

Demonstrations are followed by a question and answer period with the judge and audience.

Registration deadline is Sunday, February 20, 2021.
