UPDATE AS OF JUNE 2023

Green County Sheriff Department Staff report that they regularly see warning signage where trucks are frequently stopped along Green County roads, particularly where they are pumping animal waste into farm fields.

- 22. Require livestock and crop farmers to be responsible for road damage caused by themselves.
 - Rationale: Prohibitive cost to fix and maintain roads and the importance of quality roads in traffic safety.
 - Note: The Green County Highway Department and the Green County Sheriff's Department were both identified as lead stakeholders for this recommendation.

UPDATE AS OF JUNE 2023

Green County Sheriff Department has not noted roads damaged but farmers regularly comply with Sheriff Department requests to clean the road surface during periods where they are tracking mud and manure onto the roads during farming operations.
