The following article was found on the UW Madison site, which was secure! Food for thought, as many of us use computers, cell phones, etc. Just a quick peak for the "s" hopefully will prevent us from being scammed!



# 2 Ways To Tell If Your Communication To A Website Is Secure

Before you share any information online, it's important to make sure your communication with the website is secure. Fortunately, there are two quick checks to help you be certain:

Look at the uniform resource locator (URL) of the website. A secure URL should begin with "https" rather than "http." The "s" in "https" stands for secure, which indicates that the site is using a Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) Certificate. This lets you know that all your communication and data is encrypted as it passes from your browser to the website's server.

Look for a lock icon near your browser's location field. The lock symbol and related URL containing "https" simply mean that the connection between your web browser and the website server is encrypted, which is

important. It prevents others from eavesdropping or intercepting your communication between your browser and the website's server. But don't be fooled into thinking the website you're going to is secure—it may not be.

Remember to look for "https" and the lock icon. If you don't see those two indicators, your communication to the website is not secure. For more security tips, visit the <a href="https://www.uww.numer.com/www.num

Is it secure and legit?

While making sure the sites you visit are secure is important, you should also always be sure that a site is legitimate before entering a username, password or any other personal information. Paying close attention to the site's URL in your browser's location field, for example, can help you be certain that you're on a legitimate site rather than a look-alike impostor.

The following information is taken from Attorney General sites and I feel provides good information. Remember if you didn't reach out first, it probably is not legit!

# What are some common types of scams?

**Debt collection scams**. Most debt collectors will contact you to collect on legitimate debts you owe. ...

FDIC or Governement/IRS scams - The FDIC or other government agencies do not send unsolicited correspondence asking for money or sensitive personal information, and we will never threaten you, or demand that you pay by gift card, wiring money, or digital currency.

Grandparent scams. (they play on your heart, ask them a question back, like what's your birthday, I think I forgot it, but you actually know the date)

**Mail fraud** - Below are common warning signs of a mail scam:

- A claim that you have been specially selected
- A request that you "confirm your personal information"

A request for payment by means other than credit card – including cash, gift card, wire transfer or private courier

- Use of suspicious official-looking documents or fake government seals
- A request for your credit card or other payment mechanism for "shipping and handling" Use of threats if you don't comply – even the threat of arrest

Lottery or prize scams - IF you receive an email or phone call saying you've won a lottery and you didn't buy a ticket; it IS a fraud. No representative of *Mega Millions* would ever call, text, or e-mail anyone about winning a prize.

Tech support scams: Hackers often gain access to computers by calling and claiming to be a computer technician with a well-known company. They claim that there is a problem with your computer and ask for remote access to fix it. Do not give them access. Take your computer to a local computer company for repair if needed.

Kelly Gratz led us in doing a watercolor painting which was a lot of fun.



It is important that you indicate your tour preference choices. The minimum required for Bus Tours 1-3 is 40; Bus Tour 4 maximum of 20 each ride (two arranged for). If your first choice is cancelled, you will automatically be given your second choice. Include the tour fee for your first choice with your registration. If you need special bus accommodations, indicate on your registration form.

**Cultural Arts:** Items may be brought in Sunday (9/17) from 6:30 – 8:00 pm or Monday (9/18) from 8:00 am – 11:00am. Judging will begin at 1:00pm on Monday.

**Business Meeting:** President Eileen Gottbeheat will preside at the WAHCE, Inc., Annual Business Meeting which is open to all conference attendees. Voting delegates (County Presidents and WAHCE Board members) are required to attend. All voting delegates will sit in assigned seating. This meeting begins at 8:00 am on 9/19.

Call 1-800-648-4765, press 1 to reserve and ask for the WAHCE Annual Conference Block.
