All attendees must also comply with WI 4-H Horse policy

- SEI approved helmets, with harness fastened, must be worn at all times when mounted or driving.
- Close-toed shoes or boots are required when near a horse. Boots with a cut out heel must be worn when mounted.
- The handler, rider or driver must have control over their horse during 4-H sponsored activities or events.
- No horse may be left unattended when out of the stall or trailer.
- Leave at least one horse/pony length between animals.
- Youth under 18 must have a parent or guardian present. All riders ride at their own risk.
- Participants MUST be current 4-H members and have paid 4-H Horse project fees (\$30 per individual or no more than \$50 per family), and have submitted a color copy of their Coggins with the Premise ID to the Extension office by July 10.
