 - i. Some department hold judging BEFORE County Fair (Dept. 10, 13 & 26)
 - ii. Exhibitor Packets can be picked up before Pre-Fair Saturday
 - iii. Dept. 18 Cultural Arts will now to be judged Face-to-Face on Saturday, July 13
 - iv. Dept. 20 Photography MUST be checked in Saturday, July 13, 9-10am, with Conf. judging at 1:00pm
- b. Jr Fair General Rules & Instructions including...Conference Judging & Face-to-Face expectations (what if cannot attend...do a notecard) and Dress Code
- c. Department Rules & Expectations Review EVERY department in which you are exhibiting!!

- e. Green County Meat Animal Auction
 - i. Auction will again be in Barn 7; no animals (horizontal photos due Friday, June 28th)

 - ii. **Premier Exhibitor** (all dairy & livestock) Friday, July 19, 5:00-7:00pm @ Stock Pavilion If 75% of club's animal exhibitors participate, each club species gets 5 extra points added to their Herdsmanship average. Great Junior & Senior prizes in each species announced at end of Master Showman Contest.
 - iii. Master Showman Saturday July 20, 5:00pm @ Barn 7
- g. 4-H Volunteer Opportunities at County Fair
 - i. **Older Youth Cloverbud Judges** Saturday, July 13, 9am-2pm Older youth talk with our 4-H Cloverbuds about their exhibits. Youth must be comfortable talking with younger youth. <u>Sign up to help</u>.
 - ii. Exhibition Hall Monitoring by 4-H Clubs <u>Sign-up 1 shift per club</u>. Every 30-45 minutes, do a "walk-through", picking up litter, fixing fallen exhibits and answering fairgoers' questions. Once during shift, do sweeping or other clean-up that the building needs.

Exhibits eligible for WSF with no entry fees, but MUST complete required paperwork in Fair Office. County Fair requests exhibitors provide their own transportation.
- 17. <u>4-H Record Books</u> Cloverbud and County Record Books, and Compliance Reports due August 26 to Extension
 - a. <u>Members in 5K-2nd Grade</u> Youth in the Cloverbud project are strongly encouraged, but not required, to complete a 4- H Cloverbud Record Book. Each youth who submits a 4-H Cloverbud Record Book will be recognized at the County Level. Must be physically turned in by August 26.
 - b. Member in 3rd-13th Grade are required to fill out a record book to remain a member in good standing.
 - i. OPTION 1 4-H County Record Book This is our county's optimal record book for offering reflection, record keeping and recognition opportunities. Youth who fill out this county record book are eligible for county awards.
 - ii. OPTION 2 4-H Minimal Record Book Offers a basic level of reflection and record keeping opportunities, but is not eligible for county level recognition. MUST be recorded on Record Book Compliance Form by August 26.
 - iii. OPTION 3 4-H Club Approved Record Book –A club approved record book must be approved by members and 4-H Educator. MUST be recorded on Record Book Compliance Form by August 26.
