The Green County 4-H program uses an application and interview process to support you in building life skills as you pursue extraordinary 4-H opportunities and recognitions, including:

- **4-H Travel Scholarships** Funds to cover 25% of a 4-H Travel Experience (6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Gr)
- 4-H Key Award Top award a WI 4-H Youth can receive (11<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> Gr)
- 4-H College Scholarships Funds (\$500-\$1,000) for post-high school education (12<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> Gr)

There are three parts of this process, and further supports youth in building important life skills.

**Part 1 - Application:** Youth must submit a written application. Depending on the opportunity a youth is applying for, the youth must complete a cover letter, resume, essay, and collect a recommendation letter. Youth need to write about their 4-H experiences in a way that highlights the practice skills they have developed. Youth will...

- Use **self-discipline** to prepare the materials and ensure they are submitted on time.
- Build record keeping and communication skills while preparing for the workforce.

**Part 2 - Interview:** Youth applicants will participate in an interview with a small panel of 4-H adult volunteers and community members. Youth will...

- Practice **communication** and **social skills** as they talk about their 4-H experiences in a way that is understandable to people both within and outside of the organization.
- Use critical thinking skills to formulate appropriate answers to interview questions.

**Part 3 - Feedback:** Youth will receive a written evaluation with feedback on both their application and interview, as well notification about whether or not they were selected for an award or scholarship. Youth will build **resiliency** and **character** as they receive feedback on what they did well and what they could improve on in future applications and interviews.

# **2024 OPPORTUNITIES**

**TRAVEL FEES & SCHOLARSHIPS** – Youth register for a 4-H Travel Experience on 4HOnline, but pay the cost of the travel experience in advance of the experience to the 4-H Adult Leaders Association. Youth selected for a 4-H Travel Scholarship through the application and interview process will be eligible for a scholarship of 25% off the total cost. **Please note:** Travel scholarship awardees are required to give a presentation about their experience at an Adult Leaders meeting upon their return. Additional 4-H funding may be available from the 4-H Junior Leaders group, for active 4-H Junior Leader

## Advanced Space Academy – Huntsville, Alabama

#### When: February 15-22, 2025

Advanced Space Academy happens every other year and it explores college and career preparation through an immersive experience in science, technology, engineering and math. Trainees undergo a variety of astronaut training exercises, engineering challenges, and team building activities, all culminating in an extended duration simulated space mission. The total cost of Advanced Space Camp is approx. \$2,700.00.

4-H members must be in **10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade** at time of selection and a minimum age of 15 during the trip. The total cost for the travel experience is approx. \$1,800.

4-H members must be in **10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade** at time of the program, a minimum age of 15 and a maximum age of 18 as of January 1, year of travel. The total cost for the experience is approx. \$2,000.

National 4-H Congress is the premiere nation-wide event for 4-Hers to network with others from around the country, Canada, and Puerto Rico. While at Congress, 4-Hers engage in leadership, citizenship, global awareness, and inclusion. Registrations will be tentatively open June 2024. 4-H members must be in **9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade** at time of registration and a maximum age of 18 as of January 1, 2025. The total cost for the travel experience is approx. \$1,500.

## 4-H AWARDS

\*Spring Application\*

### 4-H Key Award

This award is the highest award a 4-H member can receive in Wisconsin 4-H. It recognizes members in **11<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> grade** and who have shown consistent growth in their 4-H program, developed their leadership ability, and been helpful to other members in their club and community. Youth must have completed at least three years of 4-H club membership and one year of youth leadership. A limit of only 3-4 members from Green County can be selected for this annual award.

Award application materials REQUIRED: Cover Letter, Resume (1-2 pages), Long Essay (150-300 words), Recommendation Form/Letter, Application Reflection and Interview Preference Form.

# 4-H COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS \*Spring Application\*

**Scholarship application materials REQUIRED:** Cover Letter, Resume (1-2 pages), Long Essay (150-300 words), Recommendation Form/Letter, Application Reflection and Interview Preference Form.

## **4-H Adult Leaders Scholarships**

Applicants must be enrolled in Green County 4-H at the time of application, have been enrolled in Green County 4-H for at least three (3) years, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the upcoming academic school year. Applicants can be awarded this scholarship only once. Annually there are three \$500 scholarships available and awarded at the discretion of the interview committee.

### **Cindi Miller Memorial Scholarships**

Applicants must be enrolled in Green County 4-H at the time of application and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the upcoming academic school year. A key criteria for selection of this scholarship will be a high level of community involvement. Applicants can be awarded this scholarship only once. Annually there are three \$1,000 scholarships available and awarded at the discretion of the interview committee.

# TIPS FOR COMPOSING YOUR APPLICATION PACKET

Reference the "Applications Requirements Chart" on the next page for what is required for each opportunity. One application can be submitted for multiple awards or scholarships, but it is CRITICAL that the applicant identifies in the COVER LETTER what exact travel scholarship(s), college scholarship(s) or award they wish to be considered for.

When it comes to the cover letter and resume, please note...

- Use a computer. You can save your work and make revisions from year to year. If you do not have a computer at home, work with your school, a friend, or a local public library. The cover letter, resume, and essay questions **must** be typed with a computer.
- Plan ahead. Go through each part of the resume and cover letter before typing. Collect your thoughts, and use the guide materials in this packet. As much as possible, think of your 4-H experience as a job. What do you do? What skills have you developed as a result of participation in 4-H? How have you personally changed as a result of your 4-H experience?
- Consider layout, design, and abbreviations. Your cover letter and resume should be easy to read and understand. Arrange your resume as illustrated in the sample copy provided.
  - Choose a common and professional font, such as Arial or Calibri. Your font size should be 11-12 point. Use the same font throughout your application documents.
  - Use between .5" and 1" margins at the top, bottom, and both sides of your page.
  - Avoid using too many abbreviations, as not everyone is familiar with them.
- The cover letter for this application should be no longer than one page, and **must** specific what award or scholarships(s) you are applying for.
  - **Travel Scholarship Applicants:** Short and concise letters are encouraged! Don't make this overly hard on yourselves; the first and last paragraph can be as short as just 1-2 sentences.
  - **<u>Award & College Scholarship Applicants:</u>** Write this letter as you would for a job application, specifying why you are qualified and deserving of this recognition.
- Order is important. Resumes are typically put together by organizing information in the order that it happened. Arrange information in reverse chronological order (most recent first) within the sections designated in the examples in this packet.

- Individualize it. This is YOUR resume and cover letter. Outlines and samples are provided to assist you, but you **must** add your own personality and experience to it.
- Proofread! Your documents should be free of spelling and grammatical errors. Use spell check and follow up by having at least two other people proofread your cover letter, resume, and essay response. Don't lose points in the process by neglecting to proofread.
- Ask for help if you need it! If you have never gone through this process, you will probably have questions. Don't hesitate to ask! Ellen's office number is (608) 328-9440 and her email is <u>ellen.andrews@wisc.edu</u>. Ask questions or get clarification if you don't understand something!

# Short Essay: (100-150 word response)

4-H youth learn important life skills through involvement in their 4-H clubs, projects and groups, such as problem solving, responsibility, cooperation, empathy and leadership. What are 1-2 life skills 4-H has enabled you to learn and practice? How will these skills help you in the future?

# Long Essay: (150-300 word response)

4-H provides youth a place to belong, matter and explore their project interests, while supported by caring adults and peers. A high quality, engaging 4-H experiences sets up to grow and thrive into the future. What has been one of your most positive and impactful 4-H experiences? What about this experience made it so impactful? How will this experience impact your future goals or perspectives?

## Tips for completing your essay response:

- Choose a common and professional font, such as Arial or Calibri. Your font size should be no less than 11 point and no larger than 12 point. Use the same font throughout your document.
- Include your name, grade, and 4-H club at the top of the page for your essay response.
- The essay response should be single-spaced.
- Use 1" margins at the top, bottom, and both sides of your page.
- Be thoughtful and honest in your response.
- Proof read your essay response, and have someone else proof read it as well for accuracy in grammar and spelling.
- You will be evaluated on your depth of thought and how clearly you can communicate.
