DEVELOPMENTAL CONTEXT (PROGRAM QUALITY) EVALUATION RESULTS

Context matters! Research shows that youth programs that emphasize Sparks, Belonging, Caring Adults, Challenging Growth, and Youth-Adult Partnerships will have better outcomes for the youth who participate.

5.23 out of 7 Your Score:

64% of youth in Green County said the 4-H programs sparked their interests, allowing them to explore new things.

BELONGING

5.75 out of 7 Your Score:

83% of youth in Green County said they felt included in 4-H and were able to interact positively with other youth.

CARING ADULTS

5.61 out of 7 Your Score:

87% of youth in Green County reported their 4-H programs are led by adults who care about and support them.

CHALLENGING GROWTH

Your 5.47 out of 7 Score:

77% of youth in Green County reported their 4-H programs were places that challenged their personal and academic growth.

YOUTH-ADULT

5.75 out of 7 Your Score:

83% of youth in Green County felt their 4-H programs were a place where they worked in partnership with adults.
