Dear 4-H Families,

I hope this newsletter finds you enjoying the final busy weeks of school. I also hope that you are finding opportunities to pursue your 4-H project interests, whether through countywide workshops, club activities, or your own independent project learning.

Project learning is an important part of the 4-H experience. It is a great way to develop a new hobby, explore a possible career path, and is essential in preparing an exhibit for the county fair. But beyond that, we hope that 4-H project learning helps our young people discover and pursue their "spark," that interest or skill that becomes a source of energy, joy, purpose, and direction in a young person's life. The county fair is meant to be a culminating learning experience of the 4-H year, rather than the only part of a youth's 4-H experience. In this newsletter, you will find details about how to **register by May 22nd** to exhibit at this summer's county fair. As always, please ask if you have any questions. We are here to help support your 4-H experience!

Finally, it is not too early to start thinking about completing your *4-H Record Book*, which is due in August to your 4-H Club leader. See our <u>Green County 4-H Forms website</u> for 4-H Record Book requirements, options and support. All 4-H Record Book forms will stay the same for 2025, but beginning in August, we will be pulling together a committee of adult and youth leaders to update our 4-H Record Book options.

In each newsletter, this section will provide some helpful insights into the 4-H program for our new and newer families.

Making Memories at 4-H Camp

4-H camp provides a unique opportunity for all youth to develop life skills. It helps youth build confidence and meet new people in a safe, supportive environment! Camp is meant for everyone, and campers come from all walks of life. Camps can be offered overnight, as day camps, or have a project focus. 4-H staff are committed to making accommodations to ensure that all youth have a chance to learn, grow, and have fun at summer camp!

Why is camp important?

Campers and youth counselors both have a lot to gain from camp! For some youth, this is their first time away from home. For others, it is an opportunity to get back together with friends. 4-H camp gives youth the opportunity to develop independence, build self-confidence, and master new skills. Youth make new friends and get to spark new interests through camp programs. Camp counselors serve as role models and develop valuable leadership skills that will be useful for a lifetime!

Each camp provides a unique experience.

Campers are divided into small groups to create a positive learning environment during the program. They participate in a wide variety of activities. Typical activities at camp include: learning sessions taught by counselors or adult volunteers, swimming, canoeing, hiking, campfires, arts and crafts, and more!

We've done this for awhile. Trust us!

4-H camps rely on years of youth development experience using research and best practices from across the nation. 4-H educators use these best practices to develop camp programming alongside their youth counselors and adult volunteers. Making camp a safe place, both physically and socially, for youth, is a priority. All youth and adult leaders receive training and educational resources to help youth work through their new experiences away from home whether it be the campers' first time or their tenth time!

Preparing for 2025 Green County Fair

It is time to submit your fair entries!!! Junior Fair Entries will be accepted from April 22 through May 22, 2025. No late entries will be accepted!! Go to the County Fair Website: http://www.greencountyfair.net and look under "Exhibitors" and



"Junior Class". There you need to:

- 1. READ the Fair General Rules & Instructions (Yes! You need to do this EVERY year!!)
- 2. READ the Department Forms for EVERY department that you are interested in showing in. This is how you will know what you an enter, what are the rules, and when will judging be.
- 3. See the Green County Fair website for Fair Entry Tutorials, Animal Health Regulations, Judging Schedule, Exhibitor Check List, and more.

READ! READ! READ! Rules change. Dates and times change. Entry options change. The ONLY way you are going to know what you need to know for the 2025 County Fair is if you take the time to read ALL the documents each year.

Showing Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, **Horses or Poultry? Premise ID Needed**

If so, during the Fair Registration process, you will be required to provide the Premise ID for the property on which your animal(s) are housed. This may mean that you need to remind the owner of the land on which you keep your animals to renew their Premise ID registration. Property owners can register new premises or renew previous registrations by visiting: https://wiid.org/premisesregistration-renewal/

Poultry Testing

For poultry to be shown at the County Fair, DATCP requires that birds must originate from a certified flock or be individually tested. Individual testing will be available on May 31 and June 1 for a small fee. Families must sign up for individual testing by May 23, 2025. Find complete details at: https://go.wisc.edu/lvl36a

2025 Green County Fair Entry Information

Fair Entries are open: April 22 - May 22

Things to remember when submitting fair entries:

- Before submitting Fair Entries, make sure to READ on the Green County Fair website, the Fair Entry Online Guidelines, Jr. Fair Judging Schedule, Exhibitor Checklist, Fair General Rules & Instructions, and the department forms for each department that you plan to exhibit in.
- If you are showing animals, make sure to READ on the Green County Fair website the Animal Health Regulation, and
 - ⇒ If planning to participate in the Meat Animal or Dairy Youth auctions, read the auction rules, as there are additional deadlines and requirements.
 - ⇒ Have the Premise ID to enter into Fair Entry for the location(s) where animals are housed, if entering Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Horses or Poultry. Don't have a Premise ID, go to: https://go.wisc.edu/aer299
 - ⇒ Have the youth's current YQCA certification number to enter into Fair Entry, if entering Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Poultry or Rabbits. Need to do YQCA yet? Go to: https://go.wisc.edu/opjp62
- The County Fair website offers helpful tutorial videos on how to submit your Fair Entries.
- Reminder, youth do not have to be enrolled in a 4-H Project to enter in a corresponding County Fair Department.

What is 4-H Outpost Camp?

4-H Outpost Camp takes place at Wyalusing State Park, south of Prairie du Chien along the Wisconsin and Mississippi River, and is led and supervised by 4-H adult chaperones from Green County. This four day educational program is for youth in grades 9-12 from Green County 4-H. Campers will sleep in tents and cook their food outdoors over an open flame. They will enjoy time exploring the trails and river front of the state park.

This program provides a great opportunity to develop leadership and cooperation skills, build responsibility and independence, and learn about our natural world in a safe environment. This camp is sure to excite and engage any youth who comes ready to make new friends and actively participate with others in exploring the great outdoors.

4-H Camp Activities

At outpost camp, you will enjoy a variety of fun camp activities planned by camp adult staff.

Hiking: During the camp, you will enjoy hiking trails with adult supervision. Trails may vary in difficulty. Steep climbs or descents and stairways may be encountered. Some trails will include steps, steep grades and rocky surfaces. Caves can be found along some of the trails and are open to exploration. So be prepared to get dirty.

Teamwork: You will get to challenge your ability to work well in teams throughout camp, whether setting up and taking down camp sites, building/tending to the fire, prepping and cooking group dinner over the campfire, or playing group games.

On one day we plan a trip to Villa Louis (a historic French plantation on the Mississippi River) and to the Effigy Mounds National Monument in Iowa. Inside the park boundaries are 20 mounds revered by the 1st Nations. On the return a stop for lunch is planned at Pete's Hamburger Stand. The oldest hamburger stand in Wisconsin. Here the campers will have their choice of hamburger (with or without onions).

Camp Fee

Camp fees are tiered this year. Please pay the tier that works for your family. This information will be kept confidential. Camp fees contribute towards campground fee, supplies, meals, snacks, camp t-shirt, and other activities.

Refund Policy: A complete refund will be made to you if you cancel before the registration deadline. No refund is given after this time, except for prorated refunds in case of major illness, accident, or death in the family.

Transportation

Adult volunteers who have been approved as authorized drivers by the University will provide carpooling from Monticello to camp and back. The group will leave about 10:00am Thursday, June 26th, and return mid-afternoon, Sunday, June 29th. More information will be mailed prior to camp.

Camp Staff

An adult volunteer trained in first aid and CPR and a certified lifeguard will be on staff and will handle health and safety needs and administer medications for youth under the age of 14. Tristate Regional Ambulance Service are ready to handle any emergencies. All campers are provided accident insurance.

The camp staff will consist of 2-3 adult volunteers, who together will serve as chaperones, role models, and activity directors for camp. All of the adult volunteers are enrolled 4-H leaders and have completed the youth protection process. Our ratio of campers to staff is no more than 6 to 1.

Wyalusing State Park

At Wyalusing State Park, camp 500 feet above the confluence of the Wisconsin and Mississippi rivers. One of Wisconsin's oldest state parks, Wyalusing features family and group campsites, hiking trails, a canoe trail, Native American burial mounds, bird watching, fishing, boating, bicycling and picnicking on bluff top overlooks. Our site will include a tent area, picnic tables, and a large fire ring. Drinking water and vault toilets are located within walking distance, while showers will be a short drive away to the Family Campground.

Campers will stay in groups of 2-4 campers of the same gender per tent. Tents are provided by the 4-H program. Outpost campers are served nutritious, family style meals, prepared by the campers at the campsite.

Youth will experience full and active days, waking up by about 7:00am and lights out at 10:00pm each day.

4-H Adventure Camp

For Campers in **7th-8th grades** as of the 2024-2025 school year. Minimum of 8 campers required.

Youth will experience the adventures of Upham Woods in a new and deeper ways than ever before, while still enjoying a few favorite of base camp.

NEW this year, Adventure campers will sleep 2 nights in the camp dorms and 1 night in tents behind the nature center.

Youth will eat some meals in the dining hall, but other meals they will work as a team to prepare and cook their own meals over a campfire.

Plans are being made to spend a exploring lesser known parts of camp by canoe, paddling to Northshore and Blackhawk Island and picnicking along the river.

In this small group camp environment, youth will focus in on building their teamwork, communication and leadership skills, while enjoying the outdoors and exploring the natural environment in new ways.

Recreation: Have fun getting active with other campers in large group games and sports, which may include running and personal contact with other participants.

Upham Woods & Camp Staff

Camp Upham Woods (<u>fyi.extension.wisc.edu/uphamwoods/</u>) is a recreational and natural resource complex. It is part of the University of Wisconsin—Madison's Division of Extension. Located on the Wisconsin River just north of Wisconsin Dells, Upham Woods consists of 318 acres of woodlands. The facility is made up of thirteen buildings that supply lodging, meals and activity resources. The cabins are located at the top of a steep hill, along with a bath house, with individual showers and bathroom facilities.

A health coordinator who is trained in first aid and CPR is on duty at all times to handle minor health and safety needs. The coordinator can only administer medications sent with the camper and as directed on the Youth Event Health form. The Dells Delton EMS is ready to handle any emergencies. Campers are covered by accident insurance.

The camp staff consists of paid Upham Woods staff, plus adult volunteers who serve as chaperones, role models, and activity directors. All of the adult volunteers are enrolled 4-H volunteers and have completed youth protection training and background checks. We have a maximum ratio of ten youth to every one adult.

Base Camp campers will be spending the majority of their time under the direct supervision of youth volunteer staff (counselors and assistant program leaders). All youth staff, ranging from age 14-19, have participated in a minimum of six hours of training. Our ratio of campers to youth staff is approximately six to one.
